St Vincent's Cottage is probably the oldest domestic building in Lynton and now houses a charming collection of curiosities, kitchen appliances, agricultural tools, printed ephemera, memorabilia and local historical items.

Founded in 1962 the museum focuses on local history and events. Nearly all the exhibits have been donated by local residents but will bring back memories for all visitors of how life has changed over the last couple of centuries. The huge development of the area in the Victorian era is reflected in the museum but the early 20th century is not left untouched in this unique collection.
